Experience Matters

FSS is built and run by actual baseball evaluators (ex-scouts, front office execs, player development staff), not just event promoters.

MLB organizations trust our product. Unlike showcase-only circuits,
FSS emphasizes growth, pro-style instruction, and player makeup—
aligning with how MLB evaluates.



Embracing Technology

FSS scouting reports and event results are leaned on heavily by MLB clubs. With Synergy, TrackMan/Hawkeye, and other advanced tools, the Future Stars Series feeds data directly into MLB organizations in the same format teams use internally. This has amplified its importance for draft prep and cross-checking.



Earning Players Trust Through Results

Top prospects prefer FSS because our emphasis on THEIR growth is the only thing that matters. FSS mirrors pro ball, gives players a chance to be directly evaluated by MLB decision-makers, and offersa development path, not just exposure. Being selected for an FSS signature event = "I'm a real prospect." It's a badge of credibility that resonates with both peers and pro evaluators.



Expanding International Operations

FSS has bridged the international and U.S. amateur scouting worlds, giving MLB clubs a more unified view of talent. Its shift from International Week to the Main Event helped bring the global player pool under the same spotlight as domestic players. Combines in Puerto Rico, Dominican Republic, Colombia, Aruba, Canada, Bahamas, Panama, and Japan have identified hundreds of potential future MLB players.

Jeremy Booth operates at the intersection of strategy, development, and culture.

Raised in a family deeply connected to sports and law, his father, Aaron Booth, was a prominent agent representing elite MLB talent which meant Booth grew up immersed in the game's culture from a young age. This upbringing instilled a blend of competitive drive, analytical thinking, and respect for the game's traditions. Coupled with a high intellectual acumen, Booth has leveraged these roots into a rare combination of instinctual evaluation, strategic foresight, and leadership gravitas.

Labeled by many as an exceptional talent evaluator and strategist, Booth is central to Future Stars Series operations, highly connected with MLB executives and scouts and known for integrating analytics with traditional scouting insight into all aspects of player development.

A fearless visionary, Booth has become synonymous with authority, insight, and influence in player development and draft operations. Having spent years at the professional levels of baseball both as a player and scout, he is a trusted advisor to numerous MLB executives and is key in recognizing emerging scouting talent.

Under his leadership, the New Balance Future Stars Series has become a unifying presence in the amateur baseball landscape, with flagship events hosted by the Red Sox, Mets, Rangers, and Dodgers. In 2024, FSS alumni made up just under 16% of MLB Draft selections and 33% of participants at the MLB Draft Combine. The program has helped secure signing bonuses totaling in the hundreds of millions across the draft and international signings and in 2025, 66 players were drafted into MLB and thousands have participated in the various regional combines and tournaments both domestically and internationally.

In additiona to his FSS responsibilities, Booth also serves as a baseball analyst for KHOU, the CBS affiliate in Houston, and a Front Office Insider for ESPN 97.5, providing in-depth, real-world perspective shaped by decades in scouting, player development, and executive leadership. He is also the author of the No. 1 Amazon bestseller "Inside the Mind of a Scout", a must-read that demystifies how professional

Events Attended: HPP Tigers Scout Day, 2025 Underclass Combine

Scouting Report: Asher plays a premium position, and his progression is trending in the right direction. He's added strength and improved his hands and agility behind the plate, and continues to show balance, a still head, and good separation with his hands in the batter's box. As he learns to use the opposite field more frequently, the value in his bat will skyrocket.



Events Attended: San Antonio Scout Day, 2024 Underclass Combine, 2024 Fresh 50, San Antonio/San Marcos Regional Combine, 2025 Underclass Combine

Scouting Report: Austin has big-league speed, projects well in center field, and shows the traits of a legitimate hitter, including getting into good hitting position. It's future plus or better speed, and a chance at a plus glove. Austin also has some present strength and room to add more to his athletic frame.



Events Attended: Angleton (TX) Regional Combine, 2025 Underclass Combine

Scouting Report: Bartee has good size but room to add more to his lean frame. He demonstrates good body control and defensively displays strong hands and actions at third base, along with a quick first step. At the plate, there's some bat speed and good hand path through the zone. Better use of his lower half will allow for more consistent, hard contact.



Events Attended: HPP Tigers Scout Day (2024), HPP Tigers Scout Day (2025)

Scouting Report: Cabral brings power potential, and his frame should allow for more strength and improved athleticism down the line. On the mound, he deploys a high three-quarter slot with a clean yet short arm path. He's displayed good control with his fastball.



Events Attended: Tyler Spartans Scout Day (2023), Tyler Spartans Scout Day (2024), 2025 Underclass Combine

Scouting Report: Campbell possesses physical projection, the ability to make hard contact with some bat speed from a wide-base setup. The power and arm both project to at least average, and he picks balls out of the first well at first base.



Events Attended: San Antonio Scout Day (2024), 2025 San Antonio/San Marcos Regional Combine, 2025 Underclass Combine

Scouting Report: Carpenter is a fast-twitch athlete with good body control, a chance at game-changing speed, and above-average defense in center field thanks to good routes and jumps. The bat has a shot to develop well with better use of his lower half, but his hands work through the zone, and he consistently made solid contact this summer.



Events Attended: 2025 National Tournament, 2025 Underclass Combine

Scouting Report: Castillo is a good 2-way guy- a tough combo of Catcher/ Pitcher. More than anything Aaron is a baseball player who loves to play, and will compete his tail off every time he goes between the lines. He has a mature body, with good lower body strength. He has a 3/4 slot and a pretty quick arm action. He does throw strikes with 2 pitches, and he repeats his delivery.



Events Attended: 2025 Underclass Combine

Scouting Report: Charves has a solid frame that can add size and strength too. He has decent hands and actions at 3B, and his arm projects to be average to slightly above in the future. He is a 2-way guy right now.



Events Attended: Oklahoma/Sandlot Regional Combine, 2025 Underclass Combine

Scotting Report: Claiborne is athletic with room to add meaningful strength to his frame. He gets good jumps in the outfield and has shown projectable arm strength and speed for center field. There is potential at the plate with contact ability and gap power as his swing matures. On the mound, he's a three-pitch right-hander with some feel for the changeup and a clean, repeatable delivery.

Scouting Report: Clark possesses good lower-body strength, quiet hands for receiving, and solid arm strength. At the plate, it's a strength-based swing with growth potential in the power department as he learns to engage his lower half better.



Events Attended: Georgia Premier Scout Day (2023), Georgia Premier Scout Day (2025), 2025 Underclass

Scouting Report: It's a projectable frame, including long arms and broad shoulders, and room to add. He throws strikes from a three-quarter slot, repeats his delivery with easy arm action, and shows good feel for his slider and changeup.



Events Attended: 2024 National Tournament, South Texas Fall Tournament, 2025 Underclass Combine

Scouting Report: Compean is athletic and combines his speed and agility with good routes to project well in center field. At the plate, it's a simple setup and swing that produces a lot of solid contact, and with better separation and use of his legs may develop average



Events Attended: Georgia Premier Scout Day (2025), 2025 Underclass Combine

Scouting Report: Cubbage is a two-way talent with a strong lower half that benefits him on the mound and at the plate. It's a three-quarter slot and short arm action.
